The 1971-'72 Glendale Senior Griffins once again rose to the heights of the previous Griffin basketball squads. Their overall record was an awesome 32-3 as they won three championships and were within five points of gaining the Ontario Goldenball semi-finals at the University of Western Ontario's Alumni Hall.

En route to their fifth consecutive Oxford-Elgin pennant they ran up 12 straight league victories and then polished off the W. C. I. Red Devils 67-40 in the semi-final and Parkside

Collegiate 65-45 in the final.

Glendale won the W.O.S.S.A. "AA" crown for the third straight time (being the first team in 20 years to do so), walloping Stratford Central 97-45 in the quarter-final, Beal Raiders of London 62-39 in the semi-final, and playing inspired and gusty basketball to defeat the heir-apparent Westminster Wildcats of London 70-61 before a packed and partisan crowd in the Griffin auditorium.

Not enough can be said of the four graduating seniors, Rick Jacob, Dennis Fairall, Rick Miggens, and Gary Nevill, but the court picture for the Griffins looks pretty rosy in the future with 9 players returning. Rick Jacob won three all-star berths - berths which he richly deserved- as the 6'4" centre averaged 20 rebounds and 23 points per game. He gained all-star recognition at the Jay-Cee Invitational in Chatham before Christmas at the University of Western Ontario's Purple and White Invitational at Christmas, and the Ontario Goldenball Tournament in March at U. W. O.

Steve Horvath, and Bill Blake.







