

***Tatler* (1907-2010)**

The *Tatler* began in 1907 as the *Tattler*, **Tillsonburg High School's** annual school newspaper. It relaunched c1930 as a modern yearbook renamed the *Tatler*. It remained in publication for decades, even after Tillsonburg High School became **Tillsonburg District High School** in 1948, **Annandale High School** in 1960, and then **Annandale Senior Public School** in 1995.

Tillsonburg High School (1894-48) chronology:

- 1886-00-00 – occupying four classrooms in a public school, Tillsonburg High School (THS) is established and begins its inaugural academic year in September; approx. 40 students enrolled
- 1894-01-01 - using land donated by the late E.D. Tillson, THS completes its first standalone facility and surrounding campus on Concession St. near the foot of Lake Lisgar (this plot of land is now occupied by Lisgar Court residential street)
- 1907-12-00 - THS publishes its first *Tattler*; its inaugural editor is mathematics teacher J.E. Minns
- ca. 1908-09 – THS finishes construction of its “west wing”
- 1921-00-00 – the Province introduces a five-year secondary curriculum, including Grades 9-13
- 1922-00-00 – THS finishes construction of its “east wing”
- 1930-09-00 – enrollment reaches a record high
- earl 1940s – school bus system begins serving THS; students began attending from surrounding townships, some as far away as Vienna
- 1947-01-00 – THS finishes construction of its three-room annex

Tillsonburg District High School (1948-60) chronology:

- 1948-01-01 – school name officially changes to Tillsonburg District High School (TDHS)
- 1949-06-00 – school board announces plans to construct new facility on nearby Tillson Ave
- 1950-06-00 – TDHS permanently closes its 1894 campus on Concession St.; it is eventually demolished and its site replaced with a residential street
- 1950-09-00 – TDHS begins inaugural year in new facility on Tillson Ave (today 60 Tillson Ave), serving Grades 9-13
- 1950-10-13 – TDHS officially opens its new building
- ca. 1950-55 – rapidly increasing enrollment prompts the establishment of a second public high school for Tillsonburg, which is eventually built on Glendale Avenue in 1959 and opens in 1960

Annandale High School (1960-95) chronology:

- 1960-03-00 – with the official opening of Glendale High School, TDHS changes its name to Annandale High School (AHS), still serving Grades 9-13
- 1988-06-00 – per plans announced in 1984, the Province retires Grade 13 and effective in the fall replaces it with the “OAC” year
- 1993-05-19 – the Oxford County Board of Education announces that, effective Fall 1995, Glendale High School will serve Grades 10-12 plus OAC levels while AHS will serve Grades 7-9
- 1994-06-00 – AHS holds its final graduation ceremony as a secondary school

Annandale Senior Public School (1995-2010) chronology:

- 1995-09-00 – still at 60 Tillson Ave, school reopens as Annandale Senior Public School (ASPS), now serving Grades 7-9 (Glendale High School begins serving only Grades 10-12 plus OAC)
- 2003-06-00 – per plans announced years earlier, the Province retires the OAC curriculum; henceforth all public secondary schools follow a four-year program (Grades 9-12)
- 2010-09-00 – still at 60 Tillson Ave, school reopens as Annandale Public School (APS), serving elementary and intermediate grades while Glendale High School serves Grades 9-12
