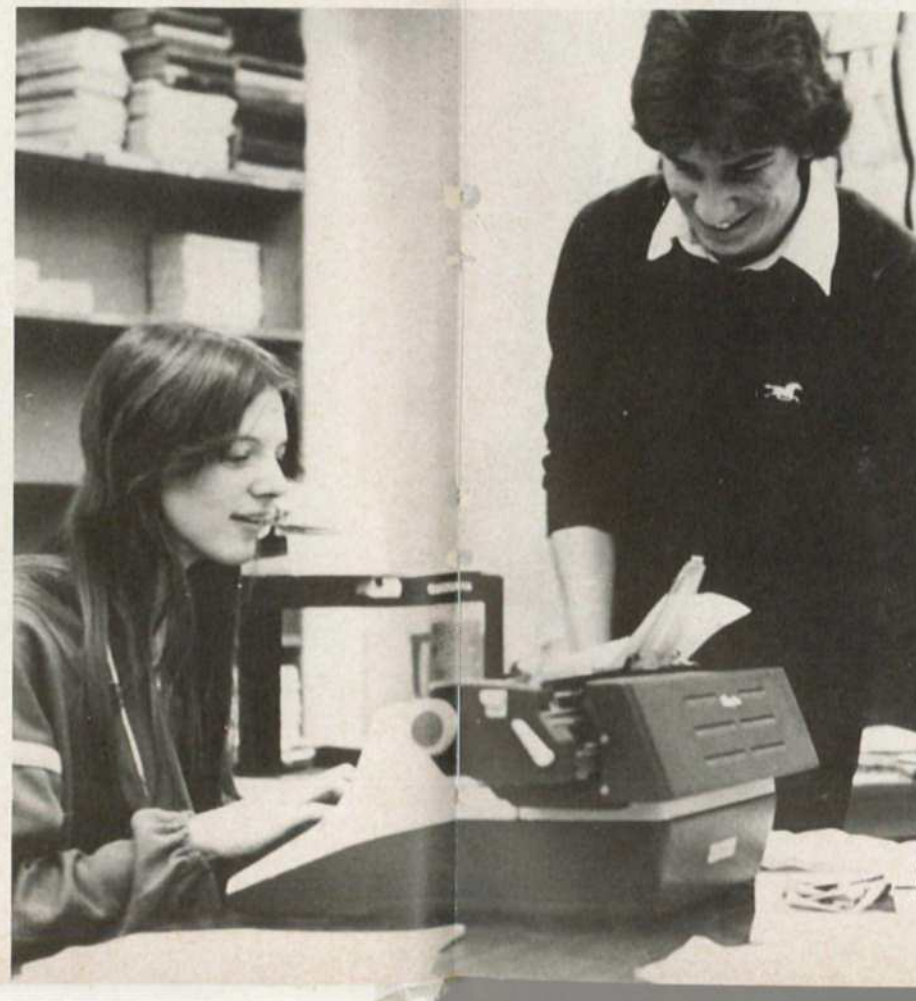
As this is my final year at IDCI, Volt '81 is a memory of the things I learned. It is an asset. And because of the many new doors I stumbled over, it is a direction.

## OUR STORY

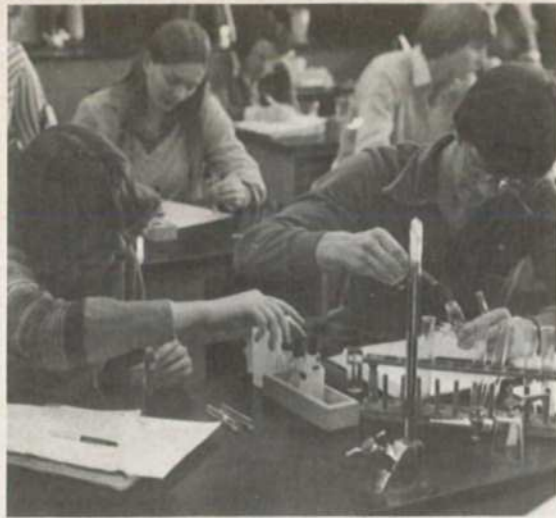

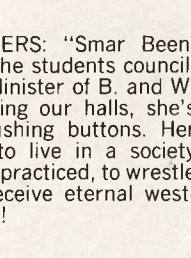

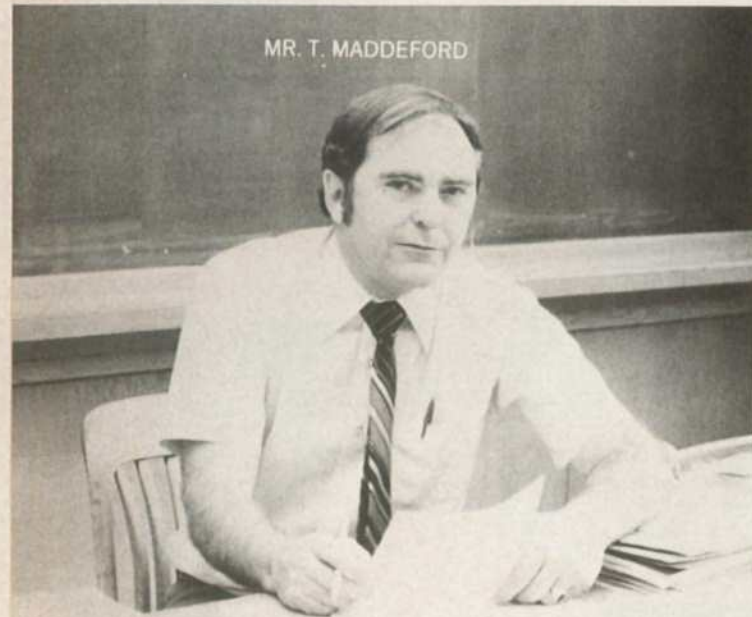

MR. T. MADDEFORD

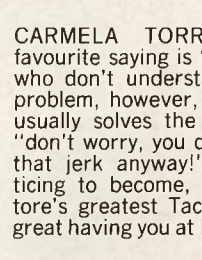

# GAMES DAY

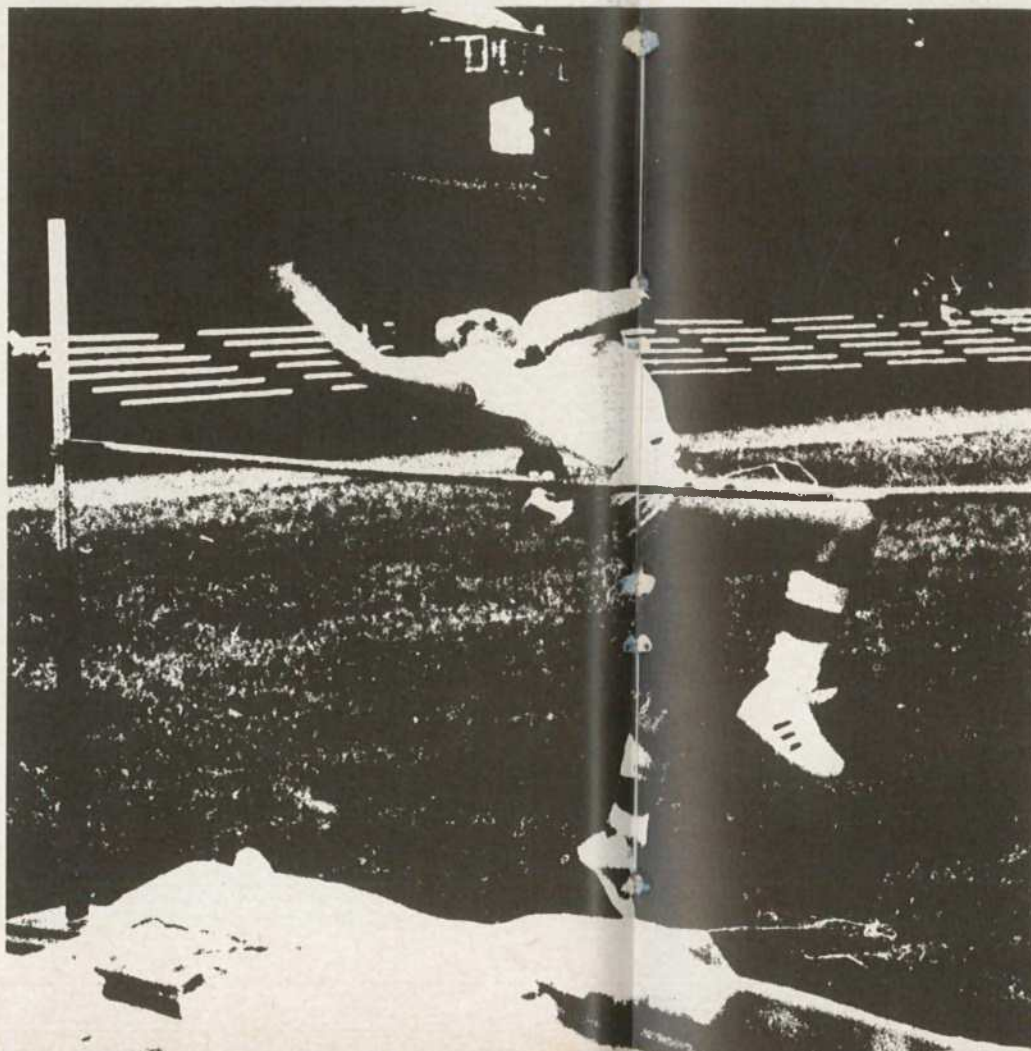
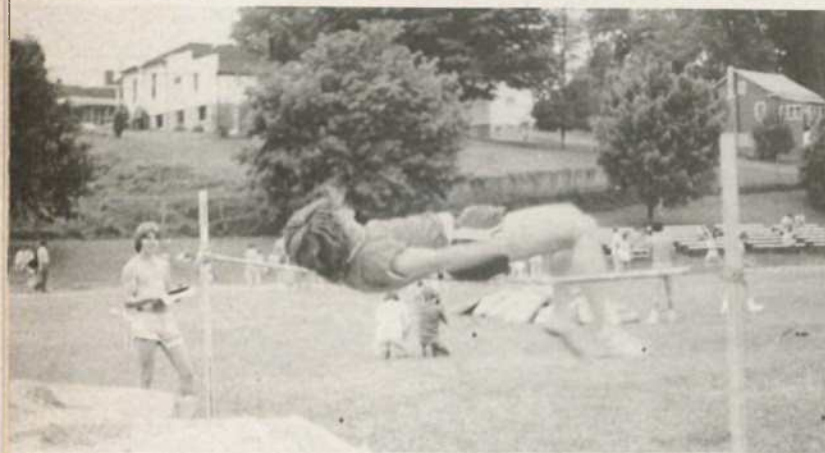
